The Karnataka Health Promotion Trust (KHPT) invites applications from committed development professionals for project which aims to develop a model for strengthening continuum of care for people with diabetes or/and hypertension in Mysore city.

Qualification, experience & Competencies:

- Diploma or degree in Nursing with more than 1 year of clinical experience at a primary, secondary or tertiary-care level health facility.
- Knowledge and experience working in Government health systems.
- Prior experience of working in a NCD related project or NCD clinics is an added advantage.
- Good communication, leadership and facilitation skills.
- Willingness and ability to travel extensively in field areas of urban PHCs in Mysuru city.
- Fluency in written and spoken Kannada and Knowledge of English language.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- To participate in the trainings on screening methods and assessment methods of risk factors and study tools.
- Conduct house to house screening of people (≥ 30 years) for diabetes and hypertension, do anthropometric measures and
- Conduct population survey to collect information on modifiable risk factors of NCDs
- Identify patients already with diabetes and hypertension and follow them up on monthly basis for regular check-ups.
- Identify persons living with high risk factors for diabetes and hypertension using appropriate tools and follow them on monthly basis
- Enter data on the tablet or mobile phone provided by the project and coordinate with field co-ordinators on a timely basis for smooth data collection

- Assess health seeking behaviour and out-of-pocket expenditure among those already diagnosed with diabetes and hypertension using appropriate tool.
- Use Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) tools to bring about lifestyle modification among adults with risk factors during field visits for screening
- Follow up and counsel people with NCDs on adherence to medications and importance of regular check-up in addition to advice on healthy lifestyle modifications
- Identify and audit all private healthcare facilities in the UPHC area.
- Refer the patients identified with the NCDs (existing and newly found) to the UPHC, and in some cases to private facilities commonly visited by patients.
- Build rapport and coordinate with the frontline workers and UPHC staff for screening, initiation of treatment and follow up.
- Conduct any other assignment as suggested by the line manager

Reporting: The Community Resource Person – Screening will be reporting to the Project Officer – NCD project, Mysore or person designated by him /her

Salary: The salary for the position is as per market rate and negotiable which will be fixed based on qualification, relevant experience, interview performance.

KHPT provides safe working environment for all its employees; follows the principle of equal opportunity and encourages women applicants. Physically challenged with required skills /knowledge and willing to travel are also encouraged to apply.
