- a. The total number of free chances availed, will be calculated on the basis of claims made in previous applications, either via a single One Time Registration ID or multiple One Time Registration ID or applications made without One Time Registration ID.
- b. The number of free chances availed by the applicants may be verified by the Commission at any stage of the selection process.
- c. An applicant who makes a false claim for exemption from payment of application fee by suppressing information regarding his/her previous application(s) is liable to rejection of application and debarment from appearing for all future examinations and selections conducted by the Commission.

5. MODE OF PAYMENT OF PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION FEE

- Preliminary Examination fee of Rs.100/- (Rupees One Hundred only) is payable by online through Net Banking/Credit card/Debit card or it can be paid by offline at State Bank of India / HDFC Bank within 2 days from the date of submission of online application by choosing the option in the online application.
- Applicants have to register their basic particulars through One -Time Registration which is mandatory on payment of Rs.150/- (Rupees One Hundred and Fifty only) towards registration fee and then should apply online for this recruitment. The One-Time Registration will be valid for 5 years from the date of registration. Thereafter, the registration should be

renewed by paying the prescribed fee. Applicants who have already registered in One-Time Registration system by paying Rs.50/- before 01.03.2017 and having validity and those who have registered for One-Time Registration on or after 01.03.2017 by paying Rs. 150/-towards One-Time Registration are exempted from paying the registration fee for this recruitment.

- Applicants have also to pay the service charges applicable to the State Bank of India / HDFC Bank.
- Applicants can avail exemption from paying examination fee as per eligibility criteria.
- Offline mode of payment in the form of Demand Draft / Postal Order etc. will not be accepted and the applications forwarded with such modes of payment will be summarily rejected.
- Those who have registered in the One-Time Registration system and paid the registration fee Rs.150/- and received the registration ID need not pay the Registration fee i.e., Rs.150/- and it is enough to pay the examination fee alone.
- Applicants who have made One-Time Registration must pay the prescribed examination fee for this recruitment unless fee exemption is claimed (One-Time Registration is only to avail exemption for Registration fee for a period of 5 years from the date of registration and it will not be considered as prescribed examination fee for this recruitment).

Age Concession

(i) For Differently Abled Persons

Differently Abled Persons are eligible for age concession upto 10 years over and above the maximum age limit prescribed above.

(ii) For Ex-Servicemen

- (a) The maximum age limit is 53 years for the applicants who belong to SCs, SC(A)s, STs, MBCs/DCs, BCs and BCMs.
- (b) The maximum age limit is 48 years for "Others" (i.e.) applicants not belonging to any of the above said categories.
- (c) The above mentioned age concession will not apply to the Ex-Servicemen applicants who have already been recruited to any class or service or category.

Note:-

- (i) "Others" [i.e., applicants not belonging to SCs, SC(A)s, STs, MBCs/DCs, BCs and BCMs] who have put in 5 years and more of service in the State / Central Government are not eligible to apply even if they are within the age limit.

Note:-

- (i) The qualification prescribed for these posts should have been obtained by passing the required qualification in the order of studies, viz., 10th + HSC or its equivalent + U.G. Degree from the recognised Institutions as required under Section 25 of Tamil Nadu Government Servants (Conditions of Service) Act, 2016.
- (ii) The applicants, who have written the final year degree examination, may also apply for the Preliminary Examination for direct recruitment to the posts included in Group-I Services, subject to the condition that they should produce the proof of having passed the degree examination while uploading the original documents for the main written examination (last date for this activity would be announced later) failing which they will not be admitted to the Main Written Examination.

- (iii) The applicants, who have passed the final professional M.B.B.S or any other Medical Examination, but have not completed the internship, may also apply to the Preliminary Examination for direct recruitment to the posts included in Group-I Services, subject to the condition that they should submit a copy of certificate from the concerned authority of the University/Institution that they had passed the requisite final professional medical examination, when admitted to the main written examination. In such cases, the applicants will be required to produce at the time of their certificate verification for oral test, original degree or a certificate from the concerned competent authority of the University/ Institution that they had completed all requirements (including completion of internship) for the award of the degree.
- (iv) Applicants claiming equivalence of qualification to the prescribed qualification should upload and submit evidence for the equivalence of qualification in the form of G.O. issued prior to the date of this notification when called for, failing which, their application will be summarily rejected. The G.Os issued regarding equivalence of prescribed qualification after the date of this notification will not be accepted.

Applicants applying for the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Cat.I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue Services) must possess the following Physical Qualifications: -

Certificate for Physical Qualification

i. Among the applicants to be admitted to the Main Written Examination those who opt for the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Category I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue Services) should produce certificate from a Medical Officer of/or above the rank of an Assistant Surgeon appointed by the Government to the Government Medical Institution obtained on or after 20.01.2020 containing the following particulars when called for:-

- ii. However, in the case of woman applicants applying for the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Category I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue Services) chest measurement and weight need not be specified in the said certificate.
- iii. The applicants who fail to produce the Physical Qualification Certificate along with other documents when called for will not be considered for the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Category I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue Services). Subsequent claims for these posts will not be entertained.
- iv. An applicant selected for appointment to the post of Deputy Collector must satisfy the Medical Board in Tamil Nadu as to his/her physique, fitness and capacity for active outdoor work.
- v. An applicant selected for appointment to the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Category I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue Services) must satisfy the Medical Board in Tamil Nadu as to his/her physique, fitness and capacity for active outdoor work and must be certified by the Superintendent of Government Ophthalmic Hospital in Chennai that his/her vision comes upto the requirements prescribed in the rules without the use of contact glasses.
- vi. Applicants with defective vision should upload and submit eye fitness certificate from a qualified eye specialist when called for along with other documents.
- vii. The applicants once selected by the Commission to the posts of Deputy Superintendent of Police (Category I) and District Officer (Fire and Rescue

Services) based on their option but who failed to satisfy the Medical Board in respect of their Physical fitness will forfeit their selection and they will not be considered for re-allotment to any other posts.

Applicants selected for appointment to the posts included in Group-I Services will be required to produce a certificate of physical fitness in the form prescribed below before his/her appointment: -

7. CONCESSIONS

- (i) Concessions in the matter of age and/or fees allowed to SCs, SC(A)s, STs, MBCs/DCs, BCs, BCMs, Destitute Widows, Differently Abled Persons, Ex-Servicemen, other categories of persons etc., are given in para 5 to 7 of 'Instructions to Applicants'.
- (ii) Persons claiming concessions referred to above and other claims made in the application have to produce evidence for such claim when called for, otherwise their application will be rejected summarily.

Note:-

In all cases, an Ex-serviceman once recruited to a post in any class or service or category, cannot claim the concession of being called an Ex-Serviceman for his further recruitment. (Proviso to Section 3(j) of Tamil Nadu Government Servants (Conditions of Service) Act, 2016).

Main Written Examination will be held at Chennai (Code: 0100) only.

10. SELECTION PROCEDURE

The selection will be made in three successive stages, viz (i) Preliminary Examination for selection of applicants for admission to the Main Written Examination (ii) Main Written Examination and (iii) an Oral Test in the form of an Interview.

The Preliminary Examination is meant to serve as a screening test only. The marks obtained in the Preliminary Examination by the applicants who are declared qualified for admission to the Main Written Examination will not be counted for determining their final order of merit. The number of applicants to be admitted to the Main Written Examination will be 50 times the number of applicants to be recruited having regard to the rule of reservation of appointments. However, in each reservation group, all the applicants who secure the same marks as that of cut off marks of their reservation groups shall also be admitted to the Main Written Examination, though the number of applicants to be admitted to the Main Written Examination may exceed 1:50 ratio. No supplemental list will be published in the place of rejected applicants (or) applicants who have failed to send documents for verification.

11. NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE / INFORMATION TO THE EMPLOYER

Persons who are in the service of the Indian Union or a State in India or in the employment of Local Bodies or Universities or Quasi Government Organizations or Public Sector Units constituted under the authority of the Government of India or of a State in India, whether in regular service or in temporary service need not send their applications through their Head of Department or office or employer. Instead, they may directly apply to the Commission after duly informing their employer in writing that they are applying for the particular recruitment subject to the condition that they should produce "No Objection Certificate" in the prescribed form, from an authority not below the Head of Department or Office or employer at the time of online certificate verification.

Note:-

- a) Persons who obtain employment after the submission of their applications and before admission to the certificate verification / oral test / counselling, should also upload / produce the "No Objection Certificate", at the time of on-line certificate verification / oral test / counselling, as the case may be.
- b) In case any criminal case is filed / disciplinary action is taken against or if any conviction / punishment is imposed on any persons after the production of "No Objection Certificate" or in any case, from the time of submission of the on-line application form up to the finalization of the recruitment process and appointment, such applicants should report this fact forthwith to the Commission indicating their One Time Registration ID. Any violation or failure to comply with these instructions will end in rejection of candidature.

The 20% reservation of vacancies on preferential allotment to Persons Studied in Tamil Medium (PSTM) will apply to this recruitment.

Applicants claiming this reservation must have studied the prescribed qualification in Tamil Medium and should have the certificate for the same. Having written the university examinations or competitive examinations in Tamil language alone will not qualify the candidate to claim this reservation. If applicants who have studied the prescribed qualification in Tamil medium are not available for selection for appointment against the vacancies reserved for PSTM, such vacancies shall be filled by eligible Non-PSTM applicants, but belonging to the respective communal category.

C. In case the PSTM claim is found to be wrong, the application shall be rejected summarily.

Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies – LV, HI, HH, LD, CP, DF, AC. Assistant Director of Rural Development Department-LD, LC, DF, AC

- G. The Differently Abled persons should submit / upload a copy of Differently Abled Certificate obtained from the Competent Authority specifying the nature of physical handicap and the degree of disability when called for by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.
- H. If no qualified and suitable women applicants are available for selection against the vacancies reserved for them, those vacancies will be filled by male applicants belonging to the respective communal categories.
- I. Even after filling up of the vacancies reserved for SC (Arunthathiyars) on preferential basis, if more number of qualified Arunthathiyars are available, they shall be entitled to compete with the Scheduled Castes other than Arunthathiyars in the inter-se-merit among them and if any posts reserved for Arunthathiyars remain unfilled for want of adequate number of qualified applicants, it shall be filled up by Scheduled Castes other than Arunthathiyars.

P. <u>Determination of the Community for Third Gender:-</u>

- (i) The Third Gender candidates, who do not possess any community certificate shall be considered under Most Backward Class as per G.O.(Ms) No.28, Backward Classes, Most Backward Class and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 06.04.2015.

ORDER:-

In the Government Order first read above, orders were issued that Third Gender may register their names in Employment Exchange offices based on the certificate identifying them as Transgender issued by the Tamil Nadu Transgender Welfare Board (TGWB) and to sponsor their names for appointment in the vacancies reserved for women category namely 30% and as well as vacancies reserved for General Category (both Men and Women) namely 70%.

- In the Government Order second read above, orders were issued classifying the "Transgender of Eunuch (Thirunangai or Aravani)" as Most Backward Class by including at SI.No.36-C in the list of Most Backward Classes.
- 3. In the Government Order third read above, among other things orders were issued, that Transgender will be identified as 'Third Gender' apart from the Binary Gender System and they have the right to decide their self-identified gender as male or female or as the third gender.
- 4. The Secretary, Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission in the D.O. letter fourth read above has sought for following clarifications in this matter with regard to:-
 - (i) Considering the Transgender under 30% reservation for Women

- (ii) Treating the Transgender candidates who have claimed communal status under Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Caste (A)/ Scheduled Tribe by producing respective Community Certificate confirming their claim.
- 5. After careful examination, in consultation with the concerned departments and the Director of Social Welfare, the Government hereby issue the following order regarding the determination of community and reservation in employment for of the Third Gender in order to streamline the procedures to be followed by the recruiting agencies like Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, Teachers Recruitment Board, Uniformed Services Recruitment Board, Medical Recruitment Board, etc., and Employment Exchange offices / appointing authorities, in sponsoring / recruiting / selecting the Third Gender candidates for appointment in Government Service:

Determination of the Community:-

- (i) The Third Gender candidates, who do not possess any community certificate may be considered under Most Backward Class as per G.O.(Ms).No.28, Backward Classes, Most Backward Class and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 06.04.2015.
- (ii) The Third Gender candidates who belong to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Caste (A)/Scheduled Tribe communities, and possess community certificate as such, may be considered as per their respective community.
- (iii) The Third Gender candidates who belong to the communities other than Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Caste (A)/Scheduled Tribe and possess community certificate as such (not covered under point (i) above) may be considered as per their own community or as Most Backward Class whichever is advantageous to them as per their option and once the individual exercises option for community selection it should be crystallized and this option should not be changed in future.

Reservation in Employment:-

- (i) The Third Gender candidates who identify themselves as "Female" by self-declaration supported by the certificate (ID card) issued by the Tamil Nadu Third Gender Welfare Board (TNTGWB) may be considered against both 30% reservation for women as well as 70% reservation for the General category (both Men & Women).
- (ii) The Third Gender candidates, who identify themselves as "Male" or "Third Gender", may be considered against the 70% reservation for General category (both Men & Women) as the case may be.

The above concessions may be granted subject to production of certificate identifying them as Third Gender or Third Gender (Male) or Third Gender (Female) issued by the Tamil Nadu Third Gender Welfare Board (TNTGWB), as the case may be.
